Lamb (kosher – split hooped mammal & chews cud) 5. Rabbit (trefah – mammal chews cud but not split hooped) 6. Carrots (kosher – all vegetables) 7. Eggs (kosher but only IF from kosher mammal) 8. Shark (trefah – fins but no scales) 9. Apple (kosher – all fruit) 10. Bacon Cheeseburger (trefah – pig AND mixed meat & dairy)
