Start	□ What's the best and worst thing you've eaten/ drunk in recent times?	
Discuss	 What food/drink item did you dislike as a child, but now love? How have your food tastes changed over the years? How have your understandings/beliefs/Christian faith changed over the years? 	
Read	Acts 10:24-48	ChesterRoadBaptist.org.uk/Watch
Explore	 Lister again v.28: What is 'guilt by association'? To what extent did Jesus abide by this in His dealings with people? When/how does 'God's Law' become '<u>our</u> law'? What is 'group think'? How can our upbringing/ inherited culture/ church experience(s) create 'group think'? We think we believe v.29-30: What did Peter do? What have you learnt about curiosity/ asking questions? What did Cornelius do? Why are stories of people's 'lived experiences' so necessary? (Especially when they are different to our own experiences.) v.34: What was the impact on Peter? Why <u>now</u>? What does this show about Peter's character/ attitude? Have you ever wrestled with/ changed your mind on a belief/ understanding? Peter realised 'this' (foods) was really about 'that' (people). Why was this so radical? v.35: Are there limits to those God's 'accepts'? Was Peter suggesting a return to living by the Law (Leviticus 11 food laws)? Where does our 'right' (righteousness) come from? Why does Peter bring it back to Jesus (v.36-43)? v.36: Why is Jesus '<u>good</u> news' (and not just for the religious 'usual suspects')? v.44-46: What was God demonstrating? v.47-48: Why do some churches withhold baptism, membership, Communion from those they "other"? What was Peter's attitude? 	
Go further	 How does the Bible itself trace the gradual revelation of God, from Creation, Fall, Israel, Law, kings, prophets, Jesus, Church New Heaven & Earth? Why did it not all come at once? Though the Bible is <i>complete</i>, why is our <i>understanding</i> of it not? What does church history show us? Acts 10 does <i>not</i> mention LGBTQ+ inclusion. Does it provide an example/ model for the Church today in responding to inclusion? How? 	
Reflect	 Which one verse stands out to you? Why do you think it grabs your attention? Which verse(s) will you need to think more about? Why? How have your understandings/beliefs changed over time? What do you understand <u>now</u> that you previously missed/ didn't see? How open are you to the possibility there is yet more you still have to grasp?
